As media rapidly evolves, FPA is expanding its classes and resources to help residents develop the essential skills needed to communicate through video and audio. Richardson will play a central role in shaping this next chapter, strengthening community partnerships, and ensuring FPA remains a vital hub for creative expression and public participation.
